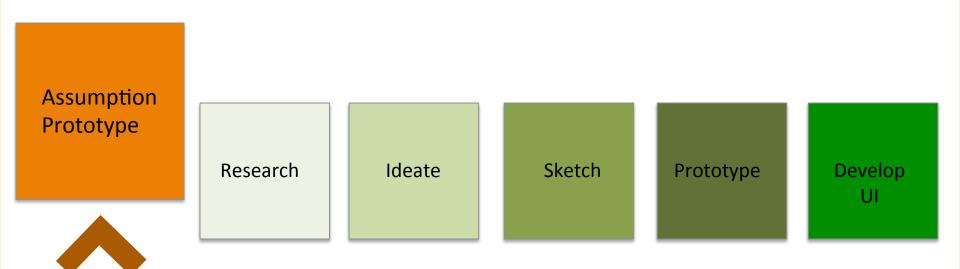
A different type of prototyping



What is Assumption Prototyping?

- Makes stakeholder assumptions concrete like a visual brainstorm.
- There isn't any preliminary research or iterations—it's based on what people know already.
- Immediately follows a knowledge audit.
- It's entirely throw-away and disposable work.

Why Assumption Prototyping?

- Quickly can demonstrate the failings or drawbacks to idea(s).
- Shows where there are discrepancies or lack of alignment between stakeholders.
- Prevents teams from wasting time discussing about how the idea(s) will work or behave by bringing them to life.
- Helps determine what the <u>minimum viable product</u> will be.
- This can help define product requirements and scope.
